Subject: Chargeable Organic Garden Waste Collection Scheme

Date: 13th January 2005

1. Purpose of the Report

To inform the Cabinet of the results of the consultation on the proposals to introduce a chargeable organic garden waste collection service

To recommend a preferred option for the collection of organic garden waste taking into consideration the results of the consultation

2. Background

At the meeting of the Cabinet on 7th October 2004, I presented a report for a chargeable organic garden waste collection service available to all domestic properties within the Borough.

The Cabinet approved the concept of introducing a chargeable organic garden waste service at the annual rates submitted in the report. A full consultation exercise was also approved with the outcome of this process being reported to this meeting of the Cabinet.

This report outlines the scheme proposed in more detail taking into consideration the findings from the consultation and the operational issues, which need to be addressed.

3. Consultation Findings

1172 householders from approximately 49,000 properties replied to the questionnaire sent out in the last edition of the Contacts magazine, which equates to a 2.5 % response rate. The full survey results are shown in Appendix 1.

Section 4 of the questionnaire dealt with the two options we were proposing for the collection of organic garden waste. From a total response of 1172, 82 replies did not express a preference for either option, 617 preferred a wheeled bin and 473 opted for reusable bags.

Of the 617 responses that opted for the wheeled bin proposal, 67.26% would be prepared to pay for the service with 52.67% of these being prepared to pay up to 50p per week, (£26.00 per annum).

470 responses were recorded to question 6.1, the option of paying for a bag collection service, of which 44.26 % were not prepared to pay anything and 55.74% prepared to pay.

In addition, Ravenshead Parish Council responded to the consultation, expressing their concern at the removal of the free service to residents within the Parish. Two other responses were received by email both objecting to paying for the scheme. The survey results show residents would be prepared to pay a small annual fee for the collection of organic garden waste and suggest a sufficient degree of interest to make the scheme financially viable.

4. Proposals

It is proposed to introduce a chargeable organic garden waste scheme commencing on Monday 4th April 2005. The proposed charges and collection dates are set out in Appendix 2 and the proposed policy and methods of collection are shown in Appendix 3.

My initial report included two current refuse collection policies, which will need to be readdressed. These were: -

Garden waste accepted in domestic refuse wheeled bin. Wheeled bins will only be emptied if they can be presented safely to the vehicle by the operative. We will not collect overloaded bins.

Although we could introduce a green waste ban for the domestic bin, in reality it will be difficult to administer and residents will "do their utmost" to hide such waste in their bin.

It will be far easier to control the amount of waste to be collected by implementing a bin lid closed policy on all wheeled bin collections. The change in policy to "Bin Lid Closed" in Broxtowe Borough Council has been well publicised by the media. A refuse collection operative received a needle stick injury and following Health and Safety advice, they introduced this policy. Ashfield, Rushcliffe, Bassetlaw, Mansfield, and Newark and Sherwood Districts also have a bin lid closed policy and I believe that it is now necessary to introduce this policy from the 1st April 2005, which would enable the policy

change to be included in our marketing and advertising leaflets for organic garden waste collections. The strict application of this policy might mean that it will not be necessary to introduce a policy banning garden waste from the domestic bins.

I also propose to review the policy issue of the garden waste in domestic wheeled bins in the autumn, which will be after a further 15,000 properties have received their second bin for dry recyclates. The twin bin scheme will restrict the amount of garden waste in the domestic bin and with our "No side waste" policy, residents will have three options for garden waste disposal, visit the household waste and recycling centres, home composting or use our new chargeable waste service.

5. Financial Implications

I have put forward a capital request in 2005/06 for £142,000. This is for the purchase of a new narrow freighter (In order that every property within the Borough can be accepted on the scheme) and initially 1,000 brown bins (240 litres) and 3,000 re-useable sacks.

Following discussions with other Authorities who have introduced this type of scheme, I would expect the participation to increase in future years so I have included within the capital request an additional £10,000 in 2006/07 and 2007/08 to cover the cost of additional brown bins and reusable sacks.

Revenue costs for 2005/06 will be £100,200 and consist of:-

Net Additional Revenue cost of Proposal	£52,200
Less existing base budget (Revenue)	(£48,000)
Vehicle running costs	£13,000
Gate fee to company receiving the organic waste	£10,000
Publicity/Marketing leaflet and distribution	£6,000
P/T Administrative Assistant	£7,700
Driver and two loaders including overheads	£63,500

However, income from charges proposed in Appendix 2 and recycling credits will be received to off set this cost. I would estimate the following for 2005/06:-

 Recycling credit
 - £18,000

 Charges
 - £52,000 (Based on 2,000 customers)

 Total Income
 - £70,000

The break even number of customers required would be approximately 1,400. (Including adjustments for gate fee charges and recycling credits).

If the Cabinet approve the recommendations in this report, it will be necessary to commence implementation arrangements immediately for a start date of April 2005.

6. Recommendations

- 1. That Cabinet approve the introduction of a chargeable organic garden waste collection scheme with effect from April 2005.
- 2. That Cabinet recommends the Personnel and Resources Committee agree to a change in the establishment of the Direct Services to include the following permanent positions:-

1 Additional Driver	(Band 4)
2 Additional Loaders	(Band 1)
1 P/T Administrative Assistant	(Band 3)

- 3. That Cabinet agree to the scale of charges for the service as set out in Appendix 2 of the report.
- 4. That the Cabinet approve the "Bin Lid Closed Policy" on all wheeled bin collections throughout the Borough with effect from April 2005.
