

#### **Report to Cabinet**

Subject: Arts Strategy for the Borough of Gedling

Date: 27 April 2005

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#### 1. Purpose of the Report

To adopt the Gedling Borough Arts Strategy.

#### 2. Background

Previous to its first arts review in 1995, Gedling Borough Council played a limited direct role in arts development with coordination of the arts delegated to a voluntary Gedling Arts Association.

The Council appointed its first Arts Development Officer (with financial support from East Midlands Arts) in 1996 and launched its first arts strategy in 1997 to cover a three-year period, at the conclusion of this period the Arts Officer left, the Council did not reappoint and has been without one until September 2004. Departmental restructures has made it difficult to maintain continuity in arts policy development, however the Council has now recognised the need to readdress its support for the arts and commissioned the Arts Strategy to provide a framework for a more pro-active approach.

An external consultant from 'Artservice' was commissioned in 2003 to produce the Gedling Arts Strategy. The aim of the report was to examine the issues around Gedling's arts provision at that time, its resources, and to identify a way forward from which a dynamic and comprehensive arts actions plan could be implemented.

The Strategy was produced following a period of widespread consultation and a comprehensive review of current arts provision and activity within the Borough of Gedling. It has been developed with reference to national, regional and local policies and strategies, and takes into account the limited arts development work undertaken by the Borough Council since its previous arts strategy action plan reached the end of its life in 2000.

The new Arts Strategy identifies five key target areas: -

- Young People
- Community Well-being
- Regeneration
- Access, equality and Diversity
- Collaboration and Partnership

Appendix 1 gives an executive summary of the strategy.

A key issue identified within the strategy was the need to employ a dedicated Arts Development Officer. The posts key responsibilities would include playing a strategic role within the Council, working to address cross-cutting agendas, and developing new programmes to increase opportunities throughout the community and with target groups.

Since the publication of the strategy, Gedling Borough Council in partnership within Arts Council England, have now jointly funded the appointment of a new Arts Strategy and Development Officer.

Services Scrutiny Committee have examined the Strategy document and its action plan as requested by the Leisure Portfolio Holder.

At it's meeting on the 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2004 Scrutiny resolved "to endorse the proposed Arts Strategy and to ask the Portfolio Holder for Leisure to ensure that there is wide ranging consultation on the future of the Bonington Theatre to secure the maintenance of theatre provision and also Pond Hills Lane Community Centre, the location of the Arts Association.

The Leisure Department will ensure the appropriate level of consultation is undertaken prior to any decisions being taken on the future of the Bonington Theatre or Pondhills Lane Community Centre.

#### 3. Proposal

To adopt the Strategy and action plan, instructing the Leisure Department to ensure its delivery and promotion.

A full copy of the report can be obtained from the Leisure Services Department.

#### 4. Resource Implications

Arts Council England has matched funded the Arts Development Post, the report identifies additional grant support from the County Council, and further funding sources will be explored in order to help fund the Action Plan.

To adopt the Arts Strategy for Gedling 2003-2008.

#### 7. Wards Affected

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#### ARTS STRATEGY EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This Strategy was produced following a period of widespread consultation and discussion and a review of current arts provision and activity within Gedling Borough, within public, private and voluntary sectors. It has been developed with reference to national, regional and local policies and strategies, and takes into account the arts development work undertaken by the Borough Council since its previous arts strategy was completed in 2000.
- 2. The Strategy proposes the strengthening of the Council's role in the arts through the appointment of a dedicated Arts Development Officer. This post would replace the existing Arts and Events Officer post and could attract time-limited funding from Arts Council England (East Midlands). The post would have a strategic role in the Authority and would work in partnership with other agencies to increase resources for the arts in Gedling.
- 3. A new Arts Development Officer would play a key role in working to address cross-cutting agendas and addressing areas of particular need, including work with young people, arts programmes related to community safety, regeneration and learning, and developing programmes to increase the range and number of opportunities to participate in the arts at local level throughout the community and with target groups.
- 4. The strategy aims to increase opportunities for all of the Borough's residents. It proposes more integrated working with a variety of partners and in the context of the Gedling Community Plan and the work of the Gedling Partnership. It seeks to increase resources for the arts by attracting additional investment into programmes, which are linked to social, and community regeneration and development.

- 5. The strategy has seven key objectives:
  - Increasing opportunities for young people to participate in and enjoy the arts.
  - Building a sustainable infrastructure for the arts in Gedling
  - Contributing to the health and well-being of local communities
  - Contributing to the social and economic regeneration of the area
  - Ensuring that as many people as possible have access to the arts, as creators, participants and audience members
  - Working in collaboration with local and regional partners to develop and increase resources for the arts
  - Supporting balanced and varied arts provision and work to extend opportunities for arts practitioners based in the Borough
- 6. In delivering the above objectives the Council will build on its existing partnership links with other local authorities in the County and strengthen and extend partnership working. In particular it will seek to develop joint programmes with the County Council's Arts Service and work with non-arts agencies to increase funding from external and non-arts sources for the arts.
- 7. The strategy will aim to increase support for local arts activity and organisations and encourage local agencies to work together more closely through a Borough Arts Forum. Schools and colleges will also be encouraged to work with the Council to increase opportunities for participation in the arts and to make better use of school facilities for community involvement with the arts.
- 8. Developing opportunities for young people to participate in the arts will be given particular attention and the Council will work to establish mechanisms for a more integrated approach to arts for young people. This will involve developing closer partnerships with agencies involved in work with young people, including the County Youth Arts Service and Creative Partnerships, the Nottingham-based arts education programme supported by Arts Council England.

- 9. The arts infrastructure (facilities, annual events and programmes) in the Borough will be addressed through further work on improving arts facilities in Arnold and making better use of existing community facilities. Partnerships will be strengthened with schools and other facility providers and further support will be given for programmes such as Village Ventures and Music in Quiet Places, which extend access to the arts for all the Borough's residents. The Council will also work with and support the voluntary sector to increase resources for the arts.
- 10. Opportunities to work with arts major regional arts and media agencies based in Nottingham City will be explored with a view to extending their outreach work in the Borough in the way that Dance 4 has operated. The Council will also explore ways of addressing current gaps in provision in particular in film and media, visual arts exhibitions, public art and literature.
