24. MINUTES

25. NOTICE OF MOTION

Upon a Notice of Motion received in the name of Councillor I. S. Gollop, it was proposed by Councillor Gollop and seconded by Councillor Feeney :-

"That this Council recognises the significant strides taken to reduce crime in the Borough and wishes to place on record its congratulations to the police, the PCSOs and the Neighbourhood Wardens for their work on the front line of that action. It calls on the Portfolio Holder for Crime Reduction to write to the appropriate bodies to pass on our thanks, and reassure their organisations of the continuing support of this Council, in terms of both action and resources, to continue to further reduce crime levels."

It was moved by Councillor R. F. Spencer and seconded by Councillor Golland that the motion be amended by the addition of the following sentence at the end of the motion:

"It calls upon the Cabinet to consult with the Council Tax payers of Gedling with regard to any proposal to continue the subsidy currently given to the Police for the employment of Police Community Support Officers after March 2006."

The Mayor put the amendment to the meeting and declared the same carried.

The amendment then became the substantive proposition and it was then moved by Councillor Gollop and seconded by Councillor Feeney that the final paragraph of the motion be further amended so that it read as follows:-

"It calls upon the Cabinet to undertake further consultation with the residents of Gedling with regard to continuing the support and investment currently given to maintaining the security and safety of our communities, through the continued employment of our PCSOs after January 2007."

The Mayor put the further amendment to the meeting and declared the same defeated.
