The Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations Review 2011

The Reasons for the Review

Section 16 of the Electoral Administration Act 2006 introduced changes to the Representation of the Peoples Act 1983 requiring the authority to conduct a review of Parliamentary Polling Districts, Polling Places and Polling Stations every four years. Gedling's last review was carried out in 2007 therefore we were required to complete another review by the end of 2011.

The main aim of the review was to ensure that all electors had reasonable access to a polling station and that the buildings which were used had facilities to cater for people that have different types of disability.

Polling Districts and Polling Places for local government elections were not automatically included in the review, but in practice they are broadly the same as the Parliamentary polling arrangements and therefore have been included.

While polling district boundaries and polling places can be changed by the Council, Ward, County and Parish electoral boundaries can only be changed by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England. Parliamentary electoral boundaries can only be changed by the Boundary Commission for England.

Important Definitions

A **Polling District** is a geographical area created by the sub-division of a constituency, ward or division into smaller parts.

A **Polling Place** is the building or area in which polling stations will be selected by the Acting Returning Officer.

A **Polling Station** is the room or area within the polling place where voting takes place. There may be more than one Polling Station in a Polling Place and this is decided by the Returning Officer for the election.

The *Acting Returning Officer*, is personally responsible for the conduct of Parliamentary elections and is usually the Chief Executive of the Council, this is the case at Gedling. The title used during elections depends on the type of election as shown in the table below.

As the review is of Parliamentary areas it is the Acting Returning Officer who is consulted. So in this case we consulted both the Acting Returning Officer for Gedling and the Acting Returning Officer for Sherwood. For ease of reading the term "Returning Officer" will be used for the rest of this document.

Conduct of the Review

The review was conducted by a Steering Group consisting of the Acting Elections Manager; the Chief Executive; the Head of Strategy & Performance; the Community Centres Manager, the Member Services Manager and the Senior Planning Officer.

This group considered representations received during the consultation period, investigated options and identified recommendations for consideration by the full Council on 5th October 2011.

Consultation

A six week period of consultation took place. Any elector within the Gedling Borough area was able to make representations. The review was publicised in the Contacts Magazine and on the Website. In addition, representations were sought from persons and organisations that are considered to have a particular interest or expertise, for example in relation to access to premises or facilities for persons who have a disability.

Consultees were advised to take the following considerations, substantially taken from Electoral Commission guidance, into account when making representations:-

When considering Polling Districts:-

- Boundaries: Are they well defined? For example, do they follow the natural boundaries of the area? If not, is it clear which properties belong in the polling district?
- Location: Are there suitable transport links within the polling district, and how do they relate to the areas of the district that are most highly populated? Are there any obstacles to voters crossing the current polling district and reaching the polling place e.g., steep hills, impassable major roads, railway lines, rivers?

When considering Polling Places:-

- Polling Places should not be changed without good reason, electors get used to their station and problems can occur during elections when things are changed.
- The Polling Place should be in the Polling District except in special circumstances.
- Polling Places should not be shared between Wards as this causes problems during elections.
- Where possible we should avoid electors having to pass another Polling Place on the way to their assigned Polling Place.
- The location: Is it reasonably accessible within the polling district?
 Does it avoid barriers for the voter such as steep hills, major roads, rivers, etc? Are there any convenient transport links?
- Size: Can it accommodate more than one polling station if required? If multiple polling stations are required, is the polling place ample enough to accommodate all voters going into and out of the polling stations, even where there is a high turnout? Ideally Polling Stations would have 2000 electors or less.
- Suitability: Is the building readily available in the event of any unscheduled elections? Is there any possibility that the building may be demolished as part of a new development? Is the building accessible to all those entitled to attend the polling place?

The Electoral Commission

The Electoral Commission has no role in the review but must consider representations if it is considered that the Council did not meet the reasonable requirements of electors or take sufficient account of accessibility by people with a disability. The Electoral Commission may require the Council to make changes if it agrees with the representations.

Background Information & Representations

Consultees were provided with statistical information to help inform their views, as well as details of all the wards and the associated polling places.

Representations and comments were added to this report as they were received.

Maps

Maps of Wards, Polling Districts and Polling Places were made available on the website and at the Civic Centre.

Population Growth

Figures published by the Office of National Statistics in its 2008-based Subnational Population Projections were provided. For the Gedling region this showed a growth of approximately 2,800 people of 18 or above, around a 3% increase, between 2011 and 2015. While this is a significant number, in the last year nearly a thousand new postal votes were granted, so this is likely to more than compensate for the increase in the use of polling stations. See the Postal Voting section later in the report for more details. We therefore suggested that Consultees would be better placed to consider the large scale proposed development site information below as a guide to population increase.

Postal Voting

In the May 2011 elections, 13766 postal votes were issued, including temporary ones, and the postal voting rate is around 14.8% of the Borough electorate. Over the last year 949 new postal votes were granted. We believe the proportion of people voting by post will continue to increase at least for the next few years, which as discussed previously, will offset any growth in Polling Station numbers.

The Returning Officer's Comments And Proposals

The approach taken to this review is to keep changes to a minimum and only to suggest modifications where absolutely necessary. The main reasons for this are:-

- Firstly, there were very few concerns expressed, or problems encountered, in relation to polling districts, places and stations during the 2010 General Election or the 2011 Local Election and National Referendum.
- Secondly, the new administration at Gedling Borough Council has signalled an intention to reduce the size of the Council and a review of electoral arrangements has now been requested, to be carried out by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England. Again, this could result in knock-on changes to polling districts, places and stations.

Comments received from consultation

Feedback was received from the Presiding Officer of Porchester Junior School to say there were no problems with the facilities.

Feedback was received from the Presiding Officer for Richard Herrod Leisure Centre to say there were no complaints about the facilities although some voters had complained about the travelling distance of the polling station.

Feedback was received from the Presiding Officer for Brickyard Community Centre to say that the modern building was ideal for a polling station with good access for people with disabilities.

Returning Officers Comments

No changes are proposed, although I recognise that the Richard Herrod Leisure Centre is outside of the polling district and ward boundary. I also acknowledge that voters at the farthest end of the polling district, away from the polling station, have other stations that are closer. This cannot be avoided as the closer polling stations are allocated for neighbouring wards and polling districts. The Richard Herrod Leisure Centre is a well-known, popular and prominent building in the area. It is easily accessed as it is on a main route in the area and can be accessed by vehicles and pedestrians. The building has adequate provision for disabled access and parking. As there are no other suitable facilities in the polling district, I propose that it should continue to be used.

A large increase in electors in J1 will require extra stations, however the potential development is likely to occur after the impending Parliamentary Boundary Review and Local Boundary Reviews. These events will trigger a new Polling District and Polling Place Review at which point it will be appropriate to review polling station provision. Feedback was received from the Presiding Officer for Killisick Community Centre confirming that the facilities and access were satisfactory.

A representation was received from Cllr Henry Wheeler commenting that many residents of K1 would prefer a polling station closer to home and that there would be an improved turnout if Robert Mellors Primary School was used for K1, while the Community Centre was retained for K2.

Returning Officers Comments

Wherever possible, I endeavour to avoid the use of Schools unless there is no other suitable building available.

In the case of Robert Mellors Primary School, while some electors will have less distance to travel, others will have to travel further and in view of this and to avoid a School closure, I do not propose to make any changes to the existing arrangements.

Feedback was received from the Presiding Officer for the Pavilion / Playing Field Polling Station confirming that the location was convenient and accessible.

Feedback was also received from the Presiding Officer for Ernehale Junior School confirming that the facilities and access were satisfactory.

Feedback was received from the Presiding Officer for Arnold View Primary School confirming that the facilities were satisfactory.

Representations were received regarding the use of Ernehale Junior School from the Head Teacher and Board of Governors. There were also many phone calls, emails and letters in the run up to the General Election expressing opposition to the use of the school as a Polling Station. A number of alternatives were proposed, those within the nearby proximity being:-

Weaverthorpe Scout Hut
Arnold Hill Community Centre
St. Marks Church
Ernehale Infants School (community room)
Arnold Hill School
A Mobile Unit

A representation was also received from Councillor Paul Key regarding the use of Arnold View Primary School affecting the provision of Nursery, Key Stage 1 (infant) and Key Stage 2 (Junior) education for around 350 children and their parents/carers who were required to find alternative provision probably requiring absence from employment. Alternatives suggested were:-

The Old Peoples Welfare Centre, 78 Nottingham Road Arnold Arnold Methodist Church

Wherever possible, it is advisable to avoid using schools as polling stations for the reasons covered above. However, schools are sometimes the only convenient and accessible buildings in a locality that have the required facilities. I propose that the alternatives above are fully explored and that continued use of Ernhale and Arnold View schools be as a last resort only.

Steering Group Investigations and Recommendations

L2 – Ernehale Junior School

The suggested alternatives have been considered:-

Weaverthorpe Scout Hut & Arnold Hill Community Centre

Both of these suggestions are existing polling stations in neighbouring wards. It is not advisable to use the same building for two wards due to problems this can cause in the counting of votes and the confusion caused to voters. We would therefore not recommend these venues be used for the Kingswell ward.

St. Mark's Church

St. Mark's Church is a polling station for the Woodthorpe ward, so would not be suitable for the same reasons as given above. It is also a long way inside the neighbouring polling district and could be too far for voters to walk.

Arnold Hill School

Arnold Hill School is outside of the Kingswell ward. While this isn't a reason in itself to not use it, it also located right next to the Arnold Hill Community Centre which is used as a Polling Station for the Mapperley Plains ward. This has the potential to create confusion as electors would pass this building in order to get to their assigned polling station. It is not recommended as a appropriate polling station for Kingswell.

A Mobile Unit

Mobile units are only to be used where no suitable building exists. They are not ideal venues especially if there is an election in bad weather. Costs are much higher and disabled access is more difficult than most fixed buildings. As other buildings are available, use of a mobile is not recommended.

Ernehale Infants School (next door to current Polling Station)

As the only location left the possibility of using the Community Room has been explored. A meeting with the Head Teacher at the School showed that the Community Room was an excellent venue for a polling station, the room is large enough, there is suitable disabled access, and satisfactory kitchen and toilet facilities. The possibility of the School staying open during polling was discussed, but this would not be possible due the layout of the School and its

grounds. (this is a decision for the Head Teacher and as such is outside the scope of this review).

It was proposed that the whole School campus be assigned as the Polling Place allowing the polling station to be selected from the two available school buildings, with a view to giving the Junior School a break from being a polling station at the next election.

The Head of Ernehale Junior School, was contacted and confirmed that the Junior School would be able to remain open if the Infant School was used as a polling station.

Recommendation

That the entire campus of Ernehale Infant and Junior Schools be assigned as the polling place for Kingswell L2 (See Appendix B - Ernehale Campus Boundary Map). This will provide the Returning Officer with the discretion to select which building to use for each election, with a view initially to using the Infant School to enable the Junior School to remain open.

L3 - Arnold View Primary School

The suggested alternatives are considered below. The Steering Group also considered a suggestion to use a pavilion on the King George V Playing Fields, but ruled this out as the pavilion has been demolished.

The Old People's Welfare Centre

While the building and facilities would be suitable as a polling station the Centre is not as centrally located as the Arnold View Primary School. More importantly it is located on the corner of Nottingham Road and Charles Street. This is a very busy area, especially at peak times. The building has no car parking provision and Nottingham Road has parking restrictions. Charles Street has limited parking which is usually occupied with residents cars and people using the adjacent Arnold Tyre and Exhaust Centre. For these reasons, it is not considered to be an appropriate alternative.

Arnold Methodist Church

While this is an excellent venue, it is currently the polling station for the St Mary's ward. It is not advisable to use the same building for two wards due to problems this can cause in the counting of votes and the confusion caused to voters. We would therefore not recommend this venue be used for the Kingswell ward (L3) as well.

Recommendation

That Arnold View Primary School continue to be the polling place for Kingswell (L3).


