7. APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN

It was moved, seconded and RESOLVED:

That Councillor Blandamer be appointed Chairman of the Panel.

8. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

All the panel declared a personal but none prejudicial interested in that they were colleagues of Councillor Barnes.

9. APPLICATION FOR PREMISE LICENCE – ARNOLD DAYBROOK AND BESTWOOD CLUB, PRIOR ROAD, ARNOLD

After consideration it was:-

RESOLVED:

The decision of the Licensing Panel (in exercise of its powers delegated by Gedling Borough Council as Licensing Authority) was

1. **To grant** the application for a premises licence, **subject to** the variations on times on B to O of the Operating Schedule, and

2. **subject to the following conditions:**

I. Those mandatory conditions imposed under Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003 details of which will be listed in Annex 1 of the premises licence; and

II. Those conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule details of which will be listed in Annex 2 of the premises licence;

III. The embedded restrictions on the use of the premises under The Children and Young Persons Act 1933, The Cinematography (Safety) Regulations 1955, the Licensing Act 1964 and/or the Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc) Act 1985.

IV. The conditions attached after the hearing of the Licensing Authority detailed as follows, which will be listed in Annex 3 of the premises licence.

Annex 3 conditions:

1. Except for Functions, admittance to the Premises is to be limited to those on a member's list and member's guests. Members will be allowed 2 guests per day.
2. The Premises are to be operated in accordance with the Rules of the Arnold, Daybrook and Bestwood Conservative Club, unless those rules contradict the Licence and its conditions. In such a case the Licence and conditions therein take precedent.
3. A notice will be displayed next to the telephone in the Premises at all times stating "When ordering a taxi, please ask the driver not to sound the horn"
4. The Premises management will monitor the noise levels when entertainment is being provided, and ensure that the noise levels are not excessive.
5. Clear, prominent and legible notices are to be put at all internal exits asking customers to leave the premises and area quietly and respect the rights of neighbours.
6. Doors and windows to be closed, except for access and egress, during the provision of regulated entertainment and provision of facilities for regulated entertainment.
7. A notice will be displayed stating "Customers are responsible for the behaviour of their children at all times".
8. A notice will be displayed in the car park stating that it is for use as a car park for customers and not for ball games etc.
9. The rear fire door is to be alarmed to alert the management to it being opened.
10. There shall be (quarterly/6 monthly) meetings arranged between local residents and (the management/the name of pub); the local Police Licensing Officer and the Environmental Health Officer shall be invited to attend.
11. All drink and refreshments supplied for consumption on the premises shall only be consumed within the building.
