1. Welcome, refreshments, apologies received.

Apologies received from Caitlin and Councillor Viv McCrossen.

2. Minutes of the last meeting, actions arising.

Minutes were accepted as a true record.

3. Group chat discussions: subjects members want to raise.

Members would like to push for recruitment. Possible ways to do this which were suggested is posters to be put in school and youth club notice boards, PowerPoints to be circulated in school forms and possible live streaming of Council meetings depending on logistics.

Advocate for pushing services and making sure they are delivered correctly. Would like to engage with Universities and young people about what can be done to further educational and career attainment.

Actions agreed: circulate a date, time and format for a meeting to discuss matters further. Chair Halle expressed an interest, further nominations to be identified via the group chat.

6. Guest speaker Rachel Clark, NCC Children and Young People's Mental Health and Wellbeing Programme Lead

Some points which were raised by the Youth Council in the previous meeting were addressed.

Transition from child to adult services- agreed transition procedures need improvement, and have subsequently increased the age for YP Mental Health Service eligibility from 0-18 to 0-25.

Services provided- have changed approach from just giving out a mental health diagnosis to early intervention and advice.

Awareness of services available to young people- it was suggested they need to address the general public and create a better understanding throughout all generations.

Funding- Despite hubs like Base 51 being shut down, funding is still being increased and those services are still available elsewhere.

Work being done in schools:

14 support teams will be created by 2024 consisting of fully trained NHS staff, which will be distributed across schools. Each team will be able to cover around 8000 students.

RC would like to engage Gedling Youth Council further with MH2K coproduction and consultation. **Action:** JA to liaise with RC to facilitate.
