The Directors present their report and the consolidated accounts for the year ended 31 March 2016. These comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006, the Mamorandum and Articles of Association and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) with effect from 1st January 2015.

The report is both a trustees' annual report and audirectors' report under company law. The Directors who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 7.

The name of the charity is the "Nottingham Roman Catholic Diocesan Trustees" and is referred to as "the Diocess" in this Annual Report and Accounts.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the Diocese ere:

- (1) The advancement of the Roman Catholic religion in the area of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Nottingham as determined under the laws of the Roman Catholic Church and in accordance with them.
- (2) The advancement of any charitable purpose supported by the Roman Catholic Church in any part of the world.

The Diocese of Nottingham comprises the major part of the East Midlands. It extends to the north from Merple Bridge on the outskirts of Manchester and south to Lutterworth, east to the Lincolnshire coast, and west to Burton-on-Trent. It includes the following civil administrative areas which reflect in some cases the county boundaries as they were in 1850 when the Diocese of Nottingham was erected by the Apostolic Latter Universalis Ecclesiee rather than as they are today:

Counties - Nottinghamshire (other than the district of Bassetiaw), Derbyshire (other than the areas of Bamford, Chasterfield, Clowne, Dronfield, Eddington, Hathersage and Staveley), Leloestershire (other than the area of Market Harborough which is south of the River Welland), Lincolnshire (including the City of Lincoln and excluding the area east of the River Nane and the area of Stamford which is south of the River Welland), Staffordshire (the area of Burton on Trent north of the River Trent) Unitary Area Authorities - North Lincolnshire, North East Lincolnshire and Rutland Cities - Nottingham, Derby and Leicester

Metropolitan Boroughs - Part of Stockport (Marple Bridge, east of the River Etherow and the River Goyt).

The main activities of the Diocese consist of worship in parishes. Much of the work of the Diocese, particularly in perishes, takes place by volunteers. It is not practicable to value the time spent by them.

The second commandment of all is to love thy neighbour as thyself." (Mark XII: 31, referring to Leviticus XIX:18). "So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead." (James II: 17). The mere believing of the truths of faith without any affect on our lives is valueless for eternal salvation.

In relation to "Public Benefit" the Directors who have had regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit, report on some of the activities of the charity as follows:

Seeking new followers: evangelising.

Provision of places of worship:

the provision and maintenance of buildings used for religious practice, including churches and meeting rooms used for related activities e.g. religious instruction for children, the conducting of religious ceremonies e.g. the calebration of Masses as well as marriages, funerals and the provision of the sacraments generally, the maintenance of public churchyards and cometeries.

Provision of places of worship (continued):

the provision and maintenance of religious or devotional artefacts and items used in religious services, rituals or practices, religious stained glass windows, other religious works of art within places of worship, 'passive advancement' (leaving religious buildings open for people to enter and benefit from personal spiritual contemplation).

Raising awareness and understanding of religious ballets and practices:

advancing religious doctrine and tenets of the Catholic faith.

producing and promoting religious books, information for the public, including providing religious resource centres and libraries.

promoting the study of religious teachings and practices and scriptures,

promoting religious neutratives and/or doctrines through producing and performing musical liturgy,

providing religious instruction and supervision,

providing and supporting schools and educational establishments which provide education in accordance with the principles and practices of the Catholic Faith,

support of religious office holders for acting as such.

promoting prayer, praise and study.

Religious devotionel acts:

visiting the sick and administering sacraments to the sick and dying.

Missionary and outreech work:

the provision of prison, hospital and university chapteincy, prison and hospital visiting,

pastoral work,

cultural and community activities provided either in the place of worship or in the buildings attached, gifts to schools, hospitals and relief of poverty in areas of need, developing understanding regarding peace and human rights.

Religious communication:

sermons and religious seminars, talks, meetings and conferences, street and door-to-door communications.

Retreat and pilgrimage:

provision of property for retreats,

organising the holding of long or short stay retreats,

organising open pligrimages where the pligrimage is part of the public worship.

Advancing religion generally:

ecumenical meetings and conferences.

grents are made by the Diocese to other charities in furtherance of its objectives. The chief of these are to the Nottingham Roman Catholic Diocesan Education Service, the Diocesan Sick and Retired Priests Fund, the Housekeepers Retirement Fund and the Diocesen Youth Service. Other grants may be made on application to the Board of Directors or by parishes subject to a monetary limit above which approval by the Board of Directors is also required.

Social Investment Properties:

the charity owns property at Mackworth in Derby and at Crich in Derbyshire in furtherance of its objectives which are occupied by the Nottingham Roman Catholic Diocesan Education Service and the Diocesan Youth Service respectively. The Voluntary Aided Catholic schools and Academies of the Diocese are generally owned by it.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The accounts of the Diocese distinguish between the Parishes of the Diocese and the Curia, which performs its central administration. The income of the Diocese is mainly from Parish collections, donations, legacies, grants and specific fundralising activities. The Curia is funded chiefly from the Diocesen Quota, a levy on the Parishes authorised by canon law. Other income includes investment income, interest and rents both from its own assets and those shared with the Parishes.

Reserves

The Directors are of the opinion that the assets of the Diocese are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations and to provide prudently for future expanditure. It is the policy of the Directors that the unrestricted liquid reserves of the Diocese be between one and three years of its normal expanditure. As a separate juridical person under canon law each parish is responsible for determining its own reserves policy under the general responsibility of the Board.

At 31st March 2016 the Reserves of the Diocese were £57.9m (2015; £57.2m). Of these Parishes' Restricted Funds were £42.1m (2015; £41.0m); Designated Funds were £507 thousand (2015; £650 thousand); Curie Restricted Funds were £5.9m (2015; £6.7m); Endowment Funds were £143 thousand (2015; £177 thousand); and the funds of the separate charity were £3.7m (2015;£3.2m). The unrestricted liquid reserves of the Diocese at that date were £3.1m (2015; £3.0m). The Diocese is regarded as a going concern and the accounts have been prepared accordingly.

There have been no significant balance sheet movements. The deficit balance on the Quinquannials Designated Fund will be aliminated during 2015/6 by the special Diocesan Quota set up for the purpose.

Grants received

Grateful thanks are made to the Trustees of the Sir Harold Hood Charitable Trust for grants to individuals, to the Master of the Guild of Our Lady of Ransom for a grant for poor perishes and to an individual for making a substantial grant for the Cathedral choristers over a number of years. Many other individuals and organisations have made grants and donations to perishes which have not been brought to the attention of the Directors and are therefore not formally mentioned here. Nevertheless both these and generous legacles have been very gratefully received and the thanks of the Directors are recorded for those who have made these land gifts.

Apart from the refunds of Value Added Tax received under the Listed Places of Worship Scheme, grants received have been specifically notified by the following Parishes: World War I, Nottinghem Cathedral Parish; Historic Churches, Nottinghem Good Shepherd; Crowle, North Lincolnshire Council; and Big Lottery, Nottingham Our Lady of Perpetual Succour.

Interest rates

During the year interest rates remained at historically low levels. As a net saver this has severely reduced the income of the Diocese.

FINANCIAL REVIEW (continued)

Listed investments

The listed investments are, with a minor exception, managed by the Investment Managers, in accordance with an investment policy approved by the Directors. Apart from the Fixed Interest Fund and the Foundation Masses Fund the policy is to maximise the total return from the investments on a medium to higher risk basis. These listed investments are held in the name of the Investment Manager's nominee company, on behalf of the Diocese. Additional funds were passed on to the Investment Manager during the year in particular those received as a result of the retired priests appeal. Details of the movements in investments and their performance are included in Note 7 on page 26 of these accounts.

The investment policy adopted by the Diocese provides for divestment to be required if it considers that a particular investment is not an appropriate holding for a Catholic diocese. The Diocese is a member of the Churches Investment Group, which is a group of religious charities which encourages high ethical standards of public companies.

Sick and Retired Priests Fund

The Sick and Ratired Priests Fund, a separate charity of which the Diocase is trustee, provides grants to sick and retired priests of the Diocase. In view of the large number of priests approaching the age of 75, when a parish priest is required to offer his resignation to the Bishop, the Directors have set up an appeal for the Sick and Ratired Priests Fund. This is to ensure that sufficient funds will be available to support the sick and retired priests of the Diocase when they need it. Although at present the income of the Fund is adequate it is prudent to provide for the additional grants which may become payable.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Parish Accounting

Internal control is being developed in order to improve the financial information available to the Diocess. At the same time consideration is being given as to how the Curia can better support Parishes.

Quinquennial Property Inspections

These have been commenced and will continue until completed.

Health and Safety

The Health and Safety Committee of the Board has considered and is implementing further developments in order to improve the health and safety systems of the Diocese in conjunction with a firm of Health and Safety advisors appointed by the Diocesan insurers.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Diocese as a charitable company, limited by guarantee, is governed under its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Directors are the members of the company who also appoint new directors. Major decisions are made by the Directors. Other decisions may be delegated to committees or to includiously. Under the Articles, the Bishop is ex officio Chairman. He, or if there is no Bishop, the person on whom the governance of the Diocese falls, may require that decisions with which he disagrees be not put into effect.

The affairs of the Diocese are conducted in accordance both with the national law of the United Kingdom and with the canon law of the Catholic Church. The canon law of the Catholic Church provides the internal rules under which it operates and specifically requires that the civil law is generally observed.

STRUCTURE, SOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT (continued)

The Directors are responsible for the management of the charity under the national law. They also act as the Finance Committee of the Diocese under canon law. Under canon law the College of Consultors of the Diocese must be consulted before any major acts of administration and before any substantial alteration of property. The Financial Secretary has been appointed Occonomis of the Diocese under canon law.

Training of New Directors

New Directors are provided with key documents for the Diocese, including the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the latest Annual Report and Accounts and other financial papers and the minutes of previous meetings. Unless already aware of their responsibilities as a charity trustee, for example through already being a director or trustee of a large charity, they are also provided with copies of relevant Charity Commission guidance. The Financial Secretary is responsible for this and will also meet new appointees to provide further training.

Senior Staff pay

The pay of senior staff is determined and reviewed by a committee of the Directors taking into account the work carried out for the previous year, proposed for future years and published remuneration surveys.

Cooperation with other Booles

The Diocese co-operates with other Catholic dioceses and those of the Church of England. In particular, it contributes, with other Catholic dioceses, to a number of national organisations set up by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, principally, the Catholic Trust of England and Wales.

Sick and Retired Priests Fund

The accounts of the Sick and Retired Priests Fund, a separate charity of which the Diocese is trustee, have been consolidated with the accounts of the Diocese. The Sick and Retired Priests Fund Grants Committee authorises its payments to or on behalf of the sick and retired priests of the Diocese on the basis of need.

PRINCEPAL BYENS AND UNCERTAINDIES

The main risks illusiy to affect the Diocese together with a note of ways in which the adverse effects of these may be ameliorated are as follows:

GOVERNMENCE

The structure of the Diocese means that its parishes have some independence from it notwithstending that their activities remain the responsibility of the Board of Directors. Information systems are established to monitor these activities where necessary and these are being improved.

It is considered that the loss of a senior staff member could be covered for a short period while recruitment takes place of a successor. A Financial Secretary from another diocese has been appointed to the Board of directors to assist specifically in the case of absence or illness of the Financial Secretary.

Fhanch/

The income of the Diocese is mostly by voluntary contributions but also from the return on its assets including investments and cash balances held by perishes.

The voluntary income of the Diocesa is not generally keeping pace with inflation. The return on cash balances held by parishes has declined very substantially as a result of the general fell in interest rates.

An appeal has been set up for the support of the sick and retired priests of the Diocese. Should it not reach its target then there will be a continued financial liability for them.

Financial (continued)

Quinquennial inspections may reveal latent problems in the properties owned by the Diocese.

Operational

By operating over a larger area it can be difficult to communicate with the parishes of the Diocase. Use of electronic communications is ameliorating this.

Dealing with a large amount of cash requires the setting up of special control procedures so that, as far as possible, there is always more than one person present at any time when cash is being handled.

In common with other religious charities reputational risk may arise in particular from historical abuse cases.

Internal Audit Arrangements

An internal audit programme, in order to support perishes and to improve internal control, has been set up. A report is made to the Financial Secretary following each visit and matters arising are followed up.

Health and Safety

The Health and Safety Committee of the Board receives reports from parishes, makes recommendations and sets out requirements as appropriate in furtherence of the objective of improving health and sefety within the Diocesa. The insurers have appointed a national firm of health and sefety consultants which will assist the Diocesa in this work.

We have audited the financial statements of Nottingham Roman Catholic Diocesan Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2016 which comprise the Group Statement of Financial Activities, the Consolidated and Diocesa Belance Sheet, the Group and Diocesa Cash Flow Statement and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) including FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland".

This report is made solely to the charitable company's members, as a body, in accordance with Chapter 3 of Part 16 of the Companies Act 2006. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the charitable company's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. 1. Accounting Policies

The Nottingham Roman Catholic Diocesan Trustees is a company limited by guarantee and a charity governed by its memorandum and articles of association and incorporated in the United Kingdom. The members are its Directors and their liability in usual dircumstances is limited to an amount not exceeding £10. The principal activity is that of a religious charity responsible for the civil affairs of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Nottingham. The accounts are expressed in pounds sterling.

The preparation of the Diocese's financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and essumptions that affect the reported amounts of income, expenses, assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities, at the reporting date. However, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in material adjustments to the carrying amount of the asset or liability.

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year except where stated.

1.1 Basis of Accounting

The accounts have been prepered in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Stittement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), notwithstanding that the current Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 refer to the previous Charities SORP, and the Companies Act 2006. This is the first year of transition to this basis of accounting.

Nottingham Roman Catholic Diocesan Trustees meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes(s).

1.2 Basis of Consolidation

The consolidated accounts include those of the Diocese and the Sick and Retired Priests Fund for which it acts as trustee. The separate Balance Sheet for the Diocese, excluding the balances attributable to the Sick and Retired Priests Fund, is shown on page 13 with the Consolidated Balance Sheet.

As stated in note 19 the Diocese holds a number of assets as trustee. The values of and transactions associated with those assets have been reported as stated in that note.

1.3 Funds

The accounts distinguish between those funds which are unrestricted income funds, and those which are restricted funds and special trusts. The unrestricted income funds may be used for any charitable purpose permitted under the Trust Dead. The designated funds have been designated by the Directors to a particular purpose; the designation may be removed by them. The restricted funds and permanent endowment funds are required to be used for a specific purpose. There are restrictions on spending the capital of the permanent endowment funds,

The accounts further distinguish between the Parishes and the Curia. Under national law all of the affairs of the Diocess, including those of the Parishes, are those of the charity and are the responsibility of its Directors. Under canon law each Parish is a "Juridical Parson" and its funds are required to be held separately for each Parish. Accordingly the funds described as Parishes' funds are restricted funds, unless, as in some cases, parishes occupy permanent endowment property held by the Diocese as trustee.

1.4 Incoming resources

Incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on the basis of the amounts receivable for the year. Legacies are included when there is sufficient probability of receipt as at the end of the year. Investment income is included when it is received. Gift Aid refunds are included for the year to which they relate. It is not practicable to value the time spent by volunteers.

1.5 Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities when a legal or constructive obligation has arisen. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the related expenditure.

1.6 Investments

Investments held as fixed assets (other than property investments) are revalued at mid-market value at the balance sheet data. The unquoted investments, being companies set up in conjunction with other dioceses in the United Kingdom with their surplus income being refunded to the dioceses directly, are valued at cost.

Investment land and buildings are stated in the accounts at the Directors' valuation based on insurance values as at 31^{12} March 1996 or subsequently and the directors believe that the benefit of a formal valuation would be outwaighed by its cost.

Social investment land and buildings held both to support the activities of the Diocese and to provide a return are stated either at cost or deemed cost as the case may be.

The value of land and buildings used by the schools of the Diocese has not been included in the financial statements since the amount which would be due to the Diocese from their sale after accounting for the state funding received cannot be determined with sufficient accuracy without undue expense.

Gains and losses on investments are reported in the Statement of Financial Affairs.

1.7 Taxation

As a registered charity, the charity is generally exempt from texation on its income and gains arising out of its charitable activities.

1.8 Tangible Phond Assets

Punctional land and buildings held by the Perishes at 31 March 1996 and those held by the Curia at 31 March 1999 were revelued, excluding land, using insurance values as the basis. Properties purchased since that date have been included at cost, including land. Functional tangible fixed assets otherwise acquired since those dates, including contents, have been included at valuation. The opportunity has been taken under Charities SORP FRS 102 to include the valuations at which the properties were held as daemed costs. Accordingly properties are stated in the accounts at cost or deemed cost as the case may be.

The contents of the buildings held by the parishes at 31^{10} Merch 1995 were included from that date using insurance values as the basis.

The Diocese has two defined contribution pension schemes, one for priests and one for employees which is suitable for autoenrolment the contributions being held in separately administered funds. The Pension Scheme contributions are charged to the Income and Expenditure account as they are incurred.

1.10 Grants received

Grants receivable are taken to income in the year in which they are received.

1.11 Activities

All of the activities of the Diocese are directed toward the salvation of souls. Accordingly further analysis of them or of supporting costs is not provided.

A number of the churches and other buildings owned by the Diocese are listed. Some of the properties are held subject to covenants restricting use for a Church or school or requiring that the property or part of the sale proceeds be returned to the vendor. Some of the parishes hold historic artefacts which it is not practical to have valued. Some of the properties are "Permanent Endowment" and hold by the Diocese as trustee. No adjustment has been made to the values at which the Tangible Pixed Assets are stated in relation to any of these.

A share of the proceeds for one property, if sold within 40 years of its acquisition in 2014, will be returned to the religious order from which it was originally acquired without consideration σ .

The Directors have taken advantage of the provision in the Statement of Recommended Practice to regard the amount at which valuations have been made as deemed costs.

Each parish is required to hold money in excess of its immediate requirements in a separately designated account with the Curia. Out of this, loans are made to Parishes for approved building projects at a favourable interest rate which is currently 3% for existing projects and 6% for new ones. The amounts are deposited generally with the money market, although alternative short term fixed interest investments have been purchased on the recommendation of the Diocese's investment managers.

The interest earned is pertly retained by the Curis and partly passed on to the Parishes which hold such amounts held with the Curis, pro rate both to those amounts and to the periods for which they are held.

16. Unlisted Investments and membarable of ethic companies

The Diocese owns 4,000 out of 121,200 (2014: 4,000 out of 113,200) shares in the Catholic National Mutuel, a mutual insurance company incorporated in Guernsey. The net assets of the company at 30th September 2015, the date of the last available accounts, were £31 million (2014: £30 million) and the profit for the year ended on that date, after transfer to solvency reserves, was to brask even (2014: £(1) million loss). The accounts for the year to 30th September 2016 are not expected to show amounts which are materially different.

The Diocese owns 1 share out of 9 issued and fully peld ordinary shares of Inter-Diocesen Puel Management Ltd (IDPM). The net assets of the company at 31st March 2015, the date of the last available accounts, were £26 thousand (2014: £26 thousand). The result for the year was to break even (2014: £(3) thousand loss). IDPM was set up in conjunction with other Catholic diocese in order to purchase electricity and gas for Diocesen properties more fevourably. Creditors due after one year includes £1,390 thousand (2015: £1,390 thousand) due to IDPM. In addition to this, at 31st March 2016, long term essets include the amount of £1,432 thousand (2015: £1,432 thousand). This represents the payments made on account to IDPM by the Curie on behalf of the parishes and which are recoverable from IDPM. The amount due to IDPM at 31st March 2015 for fiell consumed but not yet charged is estimated at £100 thousand (2015:£100 thousand) and is included in the Parishes' Current Lieblities. The Company Secretary is a director of IDPM.

The Discase is the sofe member of Nottinghern Roman Cathelic Discaser Education Service (NRCDES) a charitable company limited by guarantee, set up to take over its Discase Education Service. Its directors are partly appointed by the Bishop and partly by the schools of the Discase. Its results are accordingly not consolidated with those of the Discase. As stated in note 3 a number of Directors of the Discase are also directors of NRCDES.

16. Continuent Assabi

The estimated value of legacies to which the Diocese will be entitled but which have not been included as Incoming resources at 31st March 2016 is £8 thousand (2015: £20 thousand).

Sales contracts have been entered into on behalf of parishes providing for overage in cartain circumstances. A contract has been entered into providing for the sale of a chapel of ease, currently valued at £17 thousand, providing planning permission is achieved by the prospective purchaser, for £1.2 million.

17. Capta Casta Process

Capital commitments at 31st March 2016 amounted to £1,053 thousand (2015: £607 thousand) in relation to building work in parishes.

18. Continuent Liabilities

- a) The Discase has provided indemnities to Lloyds Benk pic in order for it to accept chaques made out to a payee with a different name from that of the account in question and in relation to Telepay by which payments are made to members of shalf.
- b) In common with other organisations claims have been received from victims of abuse alleged to have taken place within the Diocese. Although these claims are technically out of time it has become the practice of the courts in recent years to welve time limits in these cases. Since historical insurance records going back to 1963 are not svalishle it has not been possible for the Diocese to seek an indemnity from its insurance at the time of the alleged offences. Some insurance cover is available under the Diocese's current policies but should this be inedequate these claims may fall to be paid by the Diocese. Provision has been made in the accounts for the estimated costs of these claims to the Diocese after taking into account the available insurance cover. Should this provision be inadequate it is considered that the cost of these claims and related expenses can be met out of reserves.
