Governance and management

The company is operated under the rules of its memorandum and articles of association adopted 18 February 2013 and most recently amended 9 September 2014.

It is a company limited by guarantee and therefore has no share capital. The liability of each member in the event of winding-up is limited to £1.

Overall management of the company is the responsibility of the directors who are elected and coopted under the terms of the memorandum and articles of association. Day to day project activity is managed and carried out by paid staff.

New board members will be appointed/re-appointed at the AGM each year. Vacancies on the board will be filled by open recruitment with interviews against a job description and person specification. All posts advertised on our website and distributed through our extensive network. If required, posts are also advertised in the Nottingham Post. For the appointment of the Chair, an independent and appropriately experienced individual chairs the panel.

Objectives and activities

- The advancement of health and the relief of those in need by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability or financial hardship for the benefit of the entire population of the County of Nottinghamshire and elsewhere;
- Making the views and experiences of members of the general public known to health and social care providers;
- Enabling local people to have a voice in the development, delivery and equality of access to
 local health and social care services and facilities; the promotion of high standards by health
 and social care providers; providing training and the development of skills for volunteers and
 the wider community in understanding, scrutinising, reviewing and monitoring local health and
 care services and facilities.

Public benefit statement

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, 'Charities and Public Benefit'.

Summary of the main achievements during the period

Raising awareness of Healthwatch: We have attended 359 activities to raise awareness of Healthwatch. Since April 2015, the number of contacts on our mailing list has increased from 1124 to 1441 (22% increase). We have delivered 159 activities and directly engaged with 3702 local people.

Collecting local people's views and experiences: In total we have collected 3426 experiences from local people about health and social care services. Of these, 1569 (46%) have come from targeted groups (under 21s; disadvantaged/vulnerable; seldom heard; and over 65s). We have ensured that the experiences that we collect are shared with the service provider so that they are aware of what is working well and where improvements can be made.

Influencing decisions: We have supported four public consultations and attended 52 service quality and regulation activities, specifically Health Scrutiny Committee, Quality Surveillance Groups and Health and Wellbeing Boards. We have shared our data and insight work in these forums. For example, we shared our targeted work on renal transport, children and young people and pharmacy with the scrutiny committee and received positive feedback about these pieces of work.

Working with volunteers: We have 63 active volunteers and have attended 203 activities which were supported by them. Healthwatch has delivered 40 hours of volunteer training, and received 763 hours of volunteer time.

Financial review

The charity's policy on reserves:

The reserves are there to cover any unforeseen dips in income ensuring sustainability during the financial year; moreover to ensure full operational costs are covered for a minimum of 3 months should all income sources cease.

Financial risks:

Nottinghamshire County Council have agreed a grant of £296K for 2016/17 and confirmed they have extended our contract to 2017/18. The risk is reliance on a single funding source hence we are seeking to diversify this by seeking additional commissioned work to augment the core funding.

Exemptions

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemptions available to small companies, including the audit exemption (see statement on balance sheet).

1. Accounting policies

Basis of the preparation of the accounts

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of listed investments which are included at their market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice, applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015).

Incoming resources

All material incoming resources have been included on a receivable basis – i.e. they are included if the date receivable falls within the period covered by these accounts.

Pension costs

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme for employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the charity. Pension costs charges in the Statement of Financial Activities represent the contributions payable by the charity during the year.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write down the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of all tangible fixed assets with a cost exceeding £500 over their expected useful lives on a straight line basis.
