Purpose

The report details revised Charges for the Local Land Charge CON29, and seeks approval for their introduction from 1st April 2020.

a) To approve the revised Fees and Charges for 2020/21 for introduction from 01 April 2020.

Background

- 1.1 Question 2 on the CON29R form for Local Land Charges relates to Public Rights of Way and we have to ask Nottinghamshire County Council for the answer to this. They currently charge us £10.25 per search, and we have been advised they are going to increase this to £10.50 per search from the 1st April 2020. This will cost the Borough Council an additional £190.00 per year at the current volume of searches.
- 1.2 Question 22 on the CON29O form for Local Land Charges relates to Commons & Greens and the Borough Council act as an agent for the Nottinghamshire County Council, they currently charge £30.00 to respond. The County are increasing the cost of this from the 1st April 2020 to £32.00. This will cost the Borough Council an additional £180.00 per year at the current volume of searches

Proposal

2.1 It is proposed that the Land charges fees for the CON29R be increased by £0.25 per search to £116.35 (electronic) and £135.25 (postal) and that CON29O be increased to £38.00 per search on the 1st April 2010.

Alternative Options

3. The fee increases proposed by the County Council could be absorbed by the Borough Council at a cost of £370.00 per annum. This option is not favoured as the ability to recoup these costs will ensure that Land Charges is not subsidised to the detriment of other services.

Financial Implications

4.1 The proposed Fees and Charges detailed in this report will keep the income to the Council the same.
