Subject: Approval to Grant a Licence for use of Killisick Community Centre car park as a Mobile Vaccination Site

1. Purpose

To obtain approval to grant a licence to the NHS Sherwood Forest Hospitals Trust to use part of the car park at Killisick Community Centre for use as a mobile vaccination site.

2. Recommendation(s)

The Corporate Director is recommended to:

- a. grant a licence to the NHS Sherwood Forest Hospitals Trust to use part of the car park at Killisick Community Centre for use as a mobile vaccination site
- b. Delegates authority to the Head of Communities & Leisure to make all operational decisions relating to the licence agreement and approve any variations to the licence agreement, including in relation to extension of the licence period.

3. Background

The Covid-19 pandemic continues to be well established and prevalent in the communities of the Borough. As part of the Covid-19 Response work, the Council has been working alongside partners to identify areas in the Borough that have health inequalities and also lower Covid-19 vaccination take up. Data has identified Killisick as an area of priority in this regard and the Countywide mobile vaccination team has been directed to target its service into this area.

4. Observations from Finance

6. Observations from Legal

A licence agreement will be entered into with the NHS Sherwood Forest Hospitals Trust to occupy the land on 29th March and 5th April. This will cover what areas they are permitted use and any terms and conditions of that use. An agreement to occupy is required in line with financial regulations.

7. Equality Implications

The car park has disabled access parking on-site and further public parking in close proximity is available at Killisick Recreation Ground. This service will support communities in an area of multiple deprivation and is also accessible for other communities via public transport.

8. Carbon reduction implications

Provision is for a mobile vaccination site, the purpose of which is to be closer to individual's homes and communities, therefore reducing the travel distances to get vaccinated.

The site is accessible by public transport, however there could be a small increase in car journeys to the location following wider public promotion of the service.
