Subject: Bank Holiday Opening for Leisure Facilities 2025

Purpose

To seek approval for opening hours for the Council's leisure facilities for bank holidays in 2025, up to and including the August Bank Holiday.

Recommendation

THAT:

- 1) Approval is given for the bank holiday opening hours in the Council's leisure facilities in 2025.**

1 Background

- 1.1 Previously, reports have shown relatively poor income and attendances at the leisure centres over bank holiday periods as most regular and block booking customers do not attend. As a result of this low usage and an increase in costs associated with opening on bank holidays, leisure centres normally close, with the exception of Carlton Forum Leisure Centre, which has usually operated between 7.00am – 3.00pm. Opening Carlton Forum on a bank holiday has allowed customers, especially those on a monthly or annual membership to have access to a leisure facility to exercise. It also provides for children and families to use a facility, should

they wish, as schools are closed on the bank holidays.

- 1.2 The Richard Herrod Centre has traditionally remained open on bank holidays. Compared to an average day, usage of the Richard Herrod Centre has been modest, although opening does enable the Gedling Indoor Bowls Club to use the facility, which is part of their agreement. The centre has previously opened 10.00am until 7.00pm. This has appeared to be more successful than having a later opening.
- 1.3 Usage at the Bonington Theatre is dependent upon the films available and showing at the cinema, but usage levels on bank holidays are typically what would be expected for the films that are shown on any other days.
- 1.4 By operating a reduced service over bank holidays, it allows staff to take annual leave, where required, without having to provide full replacement cover. It therefore seems sensible in both operational and business terms to limit the number of facilities and opening hours available.
- 1.5 There are no planned maintenance works expected at any of the sites on any of the bank holidays as most contractors are closed and staffing costs make working on this day prohibitive.
- 1.6 Bank Holidays in 2025 are as follows:

Good Friday	Friday 18 th April
Easter Monday	Monday 21 st April
May Day	Monday 5 th May
Late May Bank Holiday	Monday 26 th May
August Bank Holiday	Monday 25 th August

2 Proposal

It is proposed that:-

- 2.1 Carlton Forum Leisure Centre is opened from 7.00am – 3.00pm on all bank holidays. This allows day-time availability of a wide variety of activities and sessions at one site.
- 2.2 Arnold, Calverton and Redhill Leisure Centres to close all bank holidays.
- 2.3 Richard Herrod to remain open, with opening times of 10.00am-7.00pm (bar to close at 6.30pm).
- 2.4 The Bonington Cinema to remain open as follows, although this may be

subject to change depending upon the films available for showing:

Good Friday	Friday 18 th April	9.30am – 4pm 6.00pm – 10pm
Easter Monday	Monday 1 st April	12.30pm – 10pm
May Day	Monday 6 th May	Midday – 10pm
Late May Bank Holiday	Monday 27 th May	Midday – 10pm
August Bank Holiday	Monday 26 th August	Midday – 10pm

- 2.5 It is proposed to promote open days at Carlton Forum on Monday 1st April and Monday 26th August as part of the Bank Holiday opening provision.

3 Alternative Options

- 3.1 The council could do nothing and continue to open the leisure facilities with the normal operating hours. This option would mean a waste of resource in terms of heating, lighting and staffing of the facilities for extremely low levels of customer use.
- 3.2 Alternative leisure centre opening hours to those contained in the proposal could be considered. However, the proposal takes into account previous usage levels on bank holidays.
- 3.3 The Richard Herrod Centre and/or the Bonington Theatre could be closed on these days. Although usage has traditionally been low at Richard Herrod on bank holidays, the facilities have customarily been opened to provide a service to those residents wishing to utilise the facilities that these two venues provide, as well as enabling the bowls club to operate.

4 Financial Implications

- 4.1 Staff contracted to work at the sites which are opened on these days will be expected to attend work, otherwise they will need to utilise leave, as is normal practice on closure days.
- 4.2 Where appropriate, employees working on agreed closure days will have appropriate rates of pay applied to them.
- 4.3 Although there will be an increase in costs by opening on the bank holidays, compared with normal days, the approved base budget will be utilised to pay for staffing at those sites which remain open.

5 Legal Implications

There are no legal implications associated with the revision to the opening hours.
