Minutes of the Gedling Youth Council meeting held on 17th February 2025

2. Minutes of the last meeting held on Monday 11th November 2024

3. Items raised in the youth council group chat

Christina Barbian, Nottingham CVS: 'Runspire' Young People's Sports, Health and Wellbeing initiative

Due to the absence of Chair Freddie Vokes and Youth Mayor Stella Clarke, Lydia Yates, Secretary and Vice Chair, had to step into the Chair and was therefore unable to minute these discussions in detail, however an overview is provided as follows:

Ben Haig gave an overview of the **Economic Growth and Visitor Economy Strategies** and received some thought-provoking responses from members on concerns and ideas for town centres, encouraging economic growth and the young people factor.

An interactive session was delivered by Norma and Clare in the Beeston Room covering factors around **what Heritage means to young people**, and how that can be integrated into the Council's **Heritage Strategy**.

Christian Barbian of 'Runspire' engaged members in an **online interactive survey** using their phones to vote on their health and wellbeing behaviours, preferred activities for wellbeing, and ways of reaching young people with wellbeing advice and services.

Members shared their local in and out of school safety concerns and observations with the two **Police representatives**, and there was unanimous support to revisit Police Officer engagement within PHSE and Assembly sessions in local schools. Sergeant Riley pledged to raise this within the Policing Teams and identify what resources could be made available, recognising that public services are all very stretched at present.

Sade Thomas gave a presentation about the role of the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Violence Reduction Partnership and her own role in engaging with young people. After the meeting, Sade shared a list of projects and ways in which young people can participate, as follows:

Some of the ways young people can get involved:

- Youth Charter support We want young people to assess environments that should be a place of safety for young people.
- Supporting with our research Hearing from young people to understand issues identified and what solutions are needed. (This will be extremely helpful regarding identifying our topic for the Youth Led Conference)
- We want young people to be part of the planning team of our youth led conference, which will be led by young people for young people - aimed at amplifying young people to have a platform.
- Normalising Behaviour Campaign We are looking for groups of young people to produce a campaign around youth safety in relation to places of safety in Nottingham City and County.
- Melissa Adler Children's Society Research Partake in research around gender and exploitation.

All guests pledged to take back all input received from Members at the meeting to inform and shape their ongoing work in Gedling and were thanked by the Chair for their time and attendance.

8. Update on countywide youth parliament: Amy Beckworth

9. Any other business

Councillor Fox presented a pre prepared Letter of Support from the Youth Council for the development of Young People's recreational and physical activity facilities at St Marys Park in Arnold, which included support for Special Educational Needs friendly facilities and design.
