The self declaration approach is applied to properties where a variation to an existing licence is required and to those properties that have already been inspected under the original Phase 1 scheme between 2018 and 2023 and have been assessed as low risk. The self-declaration requires that proposed landlords declare that they have inspected the property within the last six months, repaired any defects identified following this visit, assessed the property for fire safety, checked that there is working smoke detection on every level and completed any remedial works previously communicated to them by the council.</p> <p>The EPC status is checked for all properties for which we receive a licence under the Selective Licensing schemes. In this time 26 properties have been identified as having expired EPCs and 5</p>

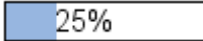

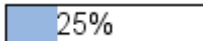

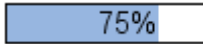
