#### Introduction

#### Bestwood Village Community Led Action Plan

This document has been produced following consultation with the residents of Bestwood Village during Spring/Summer of 2011.

The consultation was conducted by the Village Vision Steering Group supported by Bestwood and St Albans Parish Council, Rural Community Action Nottinghamshire and Gedling Borough Council.

In 2011 a questionnaire was distributed to all households in Bestwood Village and returned by 323 households. In addition young people and children were consulted. On September 24th 2011 approximately 40 residents attended an action planning event to take forward the findings of the consultations.

The following action plan is an outcome of the above activities.
